Minutes of 2YC₃ Midwestern Regional Advisory Board Meeting 133rd Conference Des Moines Area Community College Ankeny, Iowa September 29, 1995

The meeting was called to order at 8:37 AM.

ATTENDANCE:

There were 28 members present, including the following COCTYC members:

Ann Cartwright, 1995 Chair John Kenkel, 1995 Chair- Elect Dick Jones, Membership Chair Dave Klein, Past Chair Carol White, Industrial Sponsors Chair Margot Schumm, Past Chair

Two other Past Chairs were present: Jay Bardole and John Clevenger. All present introduced themselves.

MINUTES OF THE 132nd REGIONAL ADVISORY BOARD MEETING:

The group was referred to the Agenda Book for the minutes. The minutes were approved as written.

REPORTS

Canton meeting:

John Kenkel gave a report on the 132nd meeting. The theme of the conference was "The Neglected 95% - Inspiring the Chemistry Non-major." It was noted that several well-known people gave presentations, including Ken Chapman, Mickey Sarquis, Conrad Stanitski, and John Fortman. The highlight was the presentation at the Friday evening banquet. Mr. M. J. Albacete, Executive Director of the Canton Museum of Art, gave a very enlightening talk on the restoration of the frescos of Michelangelo in the Sistine Chapel.

Treasurer's Report:

In the absence of Treasurer Jeff Cramer, the Treasurer's Report was given by Dick Jones. Reference was made to pages 10-13 of Agenda Book.

College Sponsors:

This report was also given by Dick Jones. There are now 112 College Sponsors. They are listed on page 14 of the Agenda Book. We would like to have additional information on each college sponsor, such as their email addresses.

Membership:

This report was given by Membership Chair Dick Jones. It was noted that the number in the Agenda Book is incorrect. The membership count, including the number from the current conference, is estimated to be 620. Dick also presented a report on the Instrumentation Workshops sponsored by 2YC₃.

Industrial Sponsors:

Industrial Sponsors Chair Carol White presented this report, referring to page 20 of the Agenda Book. There are now 24 industrial sponsors.

Future Meeting Sites:

Dave Klein presented this report. The conference calendar is on page 21 of the Agenda Book. The next scheduled conference is the 134th at Queensborough Community College in Bayside, New York. The next Midwest Regional Conference is the 138th and will be at Sinclair Community College in Dayton, Ohio, October 4-5, 1996. The 142nd conference is an Eastern Regional meeting and will be held at Northhampton Community College in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. The Biennial Conference on Chemical Education will be the 137th conference. There will be a Midwest Regional Conference to coincide with the ACS national meeting in St. Louis in March, 1998. Details still need to be worked out. Two conferences coming up in 1996 include May 18-19 at Shoreline Community College in Seattle, and in November at San Antonio College in San Antonio, Texas. Bill Haley of San Antonio College was present and invited members to his conference.

Newsletter:

Robert Kirkley of San Jacinto College in Pasadena, Texas, is the editor for the 2YC₃ Newsletter.

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND NEW BUSINESS

Carol White, Program Chair for the $2YC_3$ portion of the program at the 14th Biennial Conference on Chemical Education, gave a report. There will be 8 $2YC_3$ symposia and 2 workshops. This represents a tremendous increase in the involvement by $2YC_3$.

Past Chair Margot Schumm gave a report from last DivCHED Executive meeting at the Chicago ACS meeting. The COCTYC is a DivCHED, but we have outgrown committee status. We are seeking voting representation, but change is slow. The ACS approved \$115,000 for a study of chemistry in 2-year colleges at their Chicago meeting. Matching funds are needed. A large percentage of the responses to DivCHED's survey regarding voting representation were from 2YC₃ members. Copies of questionnaire results are available.

Ann Cartwright gave a report on the COCTYC Leadership Conference held in Houston in July. Both 2YC₃ manuals are being updated.

An on-line chemistry conference, coming up in October, was announced. It was also announced that the final program for the Bayside meeting is available.

Personnel:

A new policy regarding the number of members on the Regional Advisory Board is being studied. The list of members from each region was reviewed and new members were

Editor's Report:

The deadline for the first newsletter of 1996 is December 8. All deadlines for the coming year have been publicized.

Voting Membership on DivCHED:

Ann Cartwright presented a report of the Chicago meeting. News of our new representative appointed to a 3-year term was well received. Ann will write a letter announcing that she has been appointed as the representative. A number of suggestions were made regarding the publicizing of the news of this representative and DivCHED interfacing in general.

OLD BUSINESS

Ed Heath Memorial Fund:

It was moved and seconded that we send \$500 in the name of Ed Heath to his college for use to regenerate ACS student affiliate program and to be used as they see fit. Motion was passed.

Plaques for 25 Year College Sponsors:

Ann obtained the plaques from Eliott Greenberg this week. A total of 14 schools qualify now. Ann will write to these schools and try to find out when the plaques can be presented.

Conference Guide Book Revision:

Dave Klein is putting it on disk. Dave would like everyone to read the manual and send revisions.

Policies and Procedures Revision:

This manual is not on disk yet. There will need to be general revision discussion at a meeting after a hard copy is available. Items that need attention are: mission statement, election procedure and candidate information.

NEW BUSINESS

Election Procedures:

An official document outlining election procedures will be published. A summary will be written for the newsletter and the document will be made available to the electorate after the changes are approved. Revisions will be ready for discussion at a spring meeting.

Other New Business:

Ann appointed Carol White and Dick Jones to attempt participation in an on-line computer conference coming up

It was moved and seconded that we authorize the treasurer to pay Dick Jones \$34.63 for additional expenses for brochure printing. The motion passed. Dick Jones suggested that we start publicizing transfer rate from 2-year colleges to 4-year colleges. It was suggested that reports be sent to Margot Schumm. Margot has written a draft proposal to ACS that a survey regarding transfer rate be done. She passed around a copy. The proposal was approved by the finance committee of ACS. A proposal now needs to be prepared to obtain matching funds for the project. Dave Klein will help Margot write the proposal.

A plaque was presented to Wendell in recognition for his service as Chair in 1994.

The meeting adjourned at 6:52pm.
