# 140TH TWO YEAR COLLEGE CHEMISTRY CONFERENCE REGIONAL ADVISORY BOARD MEETING WEST VALLEY COLLEGE SARATOGA, CA APRIL 11, 1997

The meeting was called to order by Richard Jones at 9:00 a.m.

#### I. Introductions

The following were present and introduced themselves:

COCTYC members: Richard Jones, Chair; Carol White, Chair Elect; John Kenkel, Immediate Past Chair; Jeff Cramer, Treasurer/College Sponsor Chair; Joanne Lin, Membership Chair; Michaeleen Lee, Industrial Sponsors Chair; Jay Bardole, Newsletter Editor; Ann Cartwright, Past Chair. Ralph Burns, 1988 2YC<sub>3</sub> Chair, and eleven 2YÇ members were also present.

# II. Minutes from the 139th Conference Regional Advisory Board, San Antonio College

#### A. Advisory Board Approval

Unfortunately, the agenda books for the 140th meeting had not arrived in time for the Regional Advisory Board meeting so all present were not able to read the minutes. Several COCTYC members had received copies of the agenda book prior to the meeting and the minutes were approved as written.

#### **B. COCTYC Information**

Dick Jones announced that information about the Committee on Chemistry in the Two Year College (COCTYC) can be found beginning on page 5 of the agenda book. A list of current national officers is located on the inside front cover of the agenda book and also on the front cover of each 2YC<sub>3</sub> Newsletter. Dick also announced he has requested that Jay Bardole make a newsletter editor's report, an item that will be added to the regional advisory board meeting agenda.

## III. Reports

#### A. San Antonio Conference Nov. 15-16, 1996

Carol White reported that the theme was "Recruitment and Retention of Chemistry Students." Bob Krienke, Lamar University (President, Institute of Technology), was the banquet speaker and John Kenkel's article summarizing Bob's talk appeared in the *Journal of Chemical Education*. There were several excellent speakers and tours and the meeting concluded with a panel discussion on recruitment and retention.

#### B. Treasurer's Report

Jeff Cramer reported that COCTYC has drawn upon reserves a little in order to increase support to colleges holding meetings. Seed money and training money is now provided to each host college. Jeff called attention to the complete budget report found on page 10 of the agenda book.

#### C. College Sponsor's Report

Jeff Cramer reported that there are 119 college sponsors (one was left out of the agenda book) and Jeff now has a listing of contact people, phone numbers, fax numbers, and E-mail addresses for each sponsor included in the agenda book. Jeff requested that all present check this information for accuracy. Forty-two colleges have renewed this year. Jeff urged all members to encourage colleges in their local areas to become sponsors.

#### D. Membership Report

Joanne Lin reported that the 2YC<sub>3</sub> membership was 650 as of October and had increased to around 700 by the end of 1996. 350 members have renewed their memberships for 1997 as of April 1.

#### E. Industrial Sponsors Report

Michaeleen Lee reported that there are currently 22 sponsors. She asked members to encourage companies they deal with to become industrial sponsors. Michaeleen also asked everyone to visit and talk with the exhibitors as much as possible during this meeting.

#### F. Future Meeting Sites

Ann Cartwright reported that conferences are currently being planned for as far ahead as the summer of 2000. The next conference will be a joint meeting with College Chemistry Canada (C<sub>3</sub>) in Newfoundland. Information about this conference is at the registration desk outside. The 142nd conference will be held in Bethlehem, PA, and Ron DeStefano is the program chair for that meeting. The preliminary program is in the second 2YC<sub>3</sub> Newsletter. The midwestern conference (143rd) in November will be held in Hastings, NE, and Georgiana Whipple-Van Patter is the chair for that meeting. She has sent some advance publicity which is available at the registration desk. The 144th conference will be held outside of Dallas March 27-28, 1998, just prior to the spring meeting of the American Chemical Society. Sonja Davison at Tarrant County Community College (Northeast) is the contact person for that meeting. The 15th Biennial is to be held in Waterloo, Canada, during August and the 145th 2YC, conference will be held in conjunction with the Biennial. Uni Susskind is the 2YC3 contact for the Biennial and she has requested that members send her ideas for organizing symposia. The 146th conference is planned for Bismarck State College in Bismarck, ND, on September 18-19, 1998, and the 147th conference will be held in Jacksonville, FL, at Florida Community College on November 20-21, 1998. Ann also reported that the 148th conference is slated for East Los Angeles College in conjunction with the national American Chemical Society meeting. This is a very diverse community with lots of different opportunities. The 149th conference will be held in early fall 1999 at South Holland, IL, and the 150th will be in Fort Smith, AR. 2YC<sub>3</sub> is planning a meeting in the spring of 2000 in conjunction with the American Chemical Society meeting in Las Vegas.

#### G. Editor's Report

Jay Bardole announced that he needed information for the fall meeting newsletter by June 1. There are new job openings listed on the  $2YC_3$  web page. Jay asked that all members look at the web page and give him suggestions.

#### IV. Announcements

#### A. Chair Elect Positions, 1998 and 1999; Treasurer Position

Dick Jones announced that Jeff Cramer will continue a second three-year term as treasurer of 2YC<sub>3</sub> and Tom Gruber has been elected 1998 Chair Elect. The next elections held by 2YC<sub>3</sub> will be voted upon by the entire membership as provided for in the new policies and procedures guidelines.

#### B. 15th Biennial

The 15th Biennial has been discussed previously during the future sites report.

#### C. DivCHED

Ann Cartwright is the liaison between 2YC<sub>3</sub> and DivCHED. Ann explained that COCTYC wanted to become more active in DivCHED and decided to appoint her as a representative to attend DivCHED executive committee meetings. Ann reported that many positive changes have occurred including positive changes in attitudes toward 2YC<sub>3</sub> members. She announced that DivCHED and 2YC<sub>3</sub> are offering a reduced rate for joint membership in 2YC<sub>3</sub> and DivCHED for people joining DivCHED for the first time. John Moore (editor of the *Journal of Chemical Education*) suggested that there be a 2YC<sub>3</sub> article in the *Journal*. Ann has lined up about 10 people to write articles to be included in the *Journal*.

#### **D. SOCED Guidelines**

Dick Jones reported that several 2YC<sub>3</sub> members worked on the SOCED "Guidelines for Two Year Colleges," including several past chairs of 2YC<sub>3</sub>. The Guidelines will be available soon from the home page late in the fall of 1997.

#### E. Other

John Kenkel announced that the ACS approval service for Chem Tech programs guidelines are available from the ACS home page. The guidelines help to tell administrators what programs need. The new version of the guidelines will be coming out during the fall of 1997. The guidelines will be placed on the web page during the summer. Dick Jones announced that funding has been obtained for two more instrumentation workshops one at George Mason University and one at Western Washington University.

#### V. Introduction of New Arrivals

Several new arrivals were introduced and welcomed to the meeting.

#### Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 p.m. at La Hacienda Motel on April 10, 1997, by Dick Jones.

#### I. Additions/Deletions to the Agenda

The following items were added to the agenda:

- 1. Announcement about baseline study
- 2. Ann Cartwright's name added to the J. of Chem. Ed. article (item IV., G.)

The following was deleted:

Dave Klein's name was deleted from item IV., H.

The following change was made in the order of the agenda:

The report on the West Valley College meeting by Paul O'Brien was given first so that Paul would be free to attend to last minute details.

#### II. Approval of Minutes from the 139th Conference

The following correction was suggested: that the numbers "2" and "4" be written as "two" and "four." John Kenkel made a motion that the minutes be approved as corrected and Ann seconded. The motion carried.

#### III. Reports

#### A. West Valley College - Paul O'Brien

Paul O'Brien said that he found the Conference Planning Guide was really very good and the people who put it together should be commended. Paul said that one of his problems was getting the people in his department involved in the meeting. The administration, secretaries, and facilities personnel had been very cooperative, but the people in his department have not seen any benefit in participating in professional organizations. Paul said that there are about 50 people preregistered for this meeting, but he did not have the final count. There was some publicity in the local school newspaper. Two presenters from industry scheduled to speak on Friday have canceled and there are no substitutes. A workshop on Labworks was also canceled at the last minute. Paul has rearranged the schedule as much as possible to cover the cancellations. Several exhibitors have not been firm in their commitment to come. Paul did not know exactly how many exhibitors would be present. Paul said that he did not see much need for the mentor to come and visit.

#### **B.** Personnel Matters

The COCTYC ballots for Treasurer and 1998 Chair Elect were counted. Jeff Cramer will serve a second three-year term as Treasurer and Tom Gruber was elected 1998 Chair Elect. Action item: Dick Jones will inform both candidates for Chair Elect. The next election will be by the entire 2YC<sub>3</sub> membership as outlined in the new policies and procedures guide.

#### C. Future Sites

There are two sites to be voted on. John Kenkel received a letter from Herman Bacchus, administrator at East Los Angeles College, in support of the 148th conference. Carcy Chan is the chair for that meeting. John moved and Ann seconded that the East Los Angeles College site be approved. The motion carried. There is some confusion about the letter from an administrator at South Holland, IL. John moved and Ann seconded that the South Holland site be approved for the 149th conference, contingent upon finding the administrator's letter. The motion carried. The 147th meeting in Jacksonville, FL, was discussed. Action item: Dick and Carol will work with Wendell to find a program chair for that meeting. Anna Wilson is the general chair for the 15th Biennial. Uni Susskind is the 2YC3 chair and she wants ideas for symposia. She said that there should be fewer symposia than at Clemson. Dick suggested using E-mail to generate ideas. Uni's address is tysusski@vm.occ.cc.mi.us. Action Item: Dick will send out E-mail message to solicit ideas for symposia. There will be a COCTYC and Regional Advisory Board meeting at Waterloo. There was discussion of changing the name of the Regional Advisory Board meeting. The minutes of one region get approved during the next meeting of another region. Jeff moved that the name of the Regional Advisory Board meeting be changed to "General Membership Meeting," Ann seconded, and the motion carried. The program for the 141st joint meeting with College Chemistry Canada (C<sub>3</sub>) at Newfoundland is not ready yet. There will not be a quorum of COCTYC members present. There was discussion about the need for an agenda book. Dick made a motion and John seconded that an agenda book not be printed for the 141st meeting. The motion carried. Action item: Dick will inform Dave Klein (141st meeting contact person) and Colette Mosely at ACS that there will not be an agenda book for that meeting. Jeff suggested that the dates of the conference as well as the college name be placed on the front cover of all agenda books. (The dates were left off the 140th agenda book.) Action item: John will follow up on dates and college name being placed on the cover of agenda books. Carol reported on the 144th and 146th meetings. She has talked with both Sonia Davison (144th) and Frank Koch (146th) and plans are well under way for both of those meetings. Both of them plan to attend the 140th meeting here at West Valley College and we will have an opportunity to discuss their plans with them. Dick reported that he had been called by Helga at ACS, and she told him that the ACS president has too many responsibilities associated with a national ACS meeting to be able to speak at the 2YC, meeting held in conjunction with a national meeting. Perhaps 2YC, should invite the ACS president to speak at other times. However, ACS presidents have spoken at 2YC, conferences held in conjunction with national ACS meetings in the past. Action item: Dick will check with Helga about the availability of ACS presidents. Carol will wait on sending the letter inviting the 1998 president to speak at the Tarrant County

Junior College meeting. There was discussion about the site of the next  $C_3$  meeting. Action item: Dick will contact Dave Klein to find out the location of the next  $C_3$  meeting. There was discussion about a future eastern site. Ray Turner at Roxbury expressed interest in hosting a meeting. Rudy Jones at Essex has had a meeting before and that would also be a good site. Action item: John will pursue Ray Turner first for a future site. John will also follow up on the Las Vegas site as there has been no communication from them.

#### D. Budget

Jeff provided everyone with detailed budget information including graphs of income and expenses for the past several years. The number of College Sponsors and members was at a peak in 1992. Jeff is missing budgets for 1991, 1992, 1993, and 1994 and asked that COCTYC members check their files for copies. There was some concern about 2YC<sub>3</sub> losing its tax exempt status. Jeff says that we are protected under the DivCHED umbrella. Dick is still concerned about overspending and dipping into reserves. Dick suggested that the COCTYC think about how much we need to keep in reserve and about ways to increase operating capital. Jeff suggested direct personal contact with regional advisory board members to solicit their aid in increasing membership, industrial sponsors, and college sponsors. Since we now have one less meeting per year, the number of members is down. We have tried to increase services to members by providing more funding for meetings since college budgets have become much tighter. Action item: Dick will set up an E-mail discussion.

#### E. College Sponsors

Jeff reported that there are 118 College Sponsors listed in the agenda book. One sponsor was left out making a total of 119. Forty-two have renewed so far this year.

#### F. Membership

Joanne reported that there were approximately 700 members by the end of 1996. By April this year 350 have renewed.

#### **G.** Industrial Sponsors

There are currently 22 sponsors, but one has not renewed since the end of 1995 and will be removed from the list if no response is received soon. Michaeleen has had new invoices and certificates printed. Action item: Dick authorized Jeff to pay for Michaeleen's printing costs. (The COCTYC Chair can authorize up to \$500 in operating costs.) Jay suggested setting up hyperlinks to our Industrial Sponsors on the web page. Action item: Michaeleen will contact Sponsors to determine if they want to be linked to our home page. Jeff suggested putting E-mail of the COCTYC on the home page and then later putting the Regional Advisory Board members' E-mail on the home page as well. Action item: Jay will work on E-mail addresses and also check on the possibility of setting up a chat room.

#### H. Editor's Report

Jay is now folding the newsletters since it cost effective. Jay announced that the  $C_3$  Newsletter has been mailed out. There was discussion of updating the Newsletter mailing list. Action item: Dick and Joanne will work on updating the mailing list. The next Newsletter will list the revised duties. It has taken three Newsletters to get the revised

policies and procedures and all duties covered. Jay would like to have a regular article from people who have been a part of  $2YC_3$  for awhile. In the next Newsletter he would like an article to encourage people to vote in DivCHED elections. Jay will publish the names of the College Sponsors and the Industrial Sponsors in the third and fourth Newsletters. Jay suggested getting names and addresses for a membership plea--"if you want a free Newsletter, join  $2YC_3$ ."

#### I. DivCHED

Ann said that we need to think ahead about the DivCHED liaison since it is an appointed position and her term will expire in one more year. Having the liaison at the DivCHED executive committee meetings has had a very positive effect. Ann is also on the Nominating Committee. John Moore and Ron Archer have been very responsive to 2YC<sub>3</sub>. Ann suggested that the liaison also be responsible for soliciting articles for the *Journal of Chemical Education*. John Kenkel's article just appeared in the *Journal* and Dick is working on one. Ann has lined up several more articles: one from Ken Bentsen, the Representative from Ann's region of Texas who has made many positive comments about two year colleges; an article from Jacqueline Woods, a two year college person at the Department of Education in Washington, who will write a response to Ken Bentsen's article; another article from Uni Susskind on the Guidelines; an article from John Clevenger about his role at the National Science Foundation; and one article from Gary Hicks on a pilot plant in Brazosport College. Ann reported that she will remain all day for the DivCHED executive committee meeting. Jay and Dick will come to the meeting for the 2YC<sub>3</sub> report and then return to the Exams Institute meetings.

#### IV. Old Business

#### A. 2YC<sub>3</sub>/DivCHED dues structure for new members

2YC<sub>3</sub> and DivCHED will be working together on a dues reduction for first time members of DivCHED. Members can pay a reduced rate for 2YC<sub>3</sub> and DivCHED dues. **Action item: Dick and Joanne will work on development of new joint membership form.** John noted that DivCHED is slated to vote on raising their dues. If this vote passes, we need to make sure both groups understands what the split will be.

#### **B.** Canada Conferences

C<sub>3</sub> conferences were discussed under "Future Sites."

#### C. Policies and Procedures Revision

Jay reported that one sentence was inadvertently left out of the bylaws: "The two envelope procedure practiced by the ACS will be used" (for voting). It was a typographical error and will be corrected.

#### D. SOCED Guidelines

Uni Susskind and Dick Jones worked on the committee for the SOCED Guidelines. Dick passed around the guidelines and received excellent suggestions. The Guidelines will be up on the web soon. They will be printed in the fall of 1997 and mailed to every two year school. John Spille and Harry Hajian worked on a committee that prepared a separate document for chemical technology.

#### E. COCTYC Business Calendar

John passed around a calendar of deadlines for COCTYC. Action item: Review business calendar and send suggestions/additions to John.

#### F. 15th Biennial

The Biennial has already been discussed under "Future Sites."

#### G. Journal of Chemical Education Article

Articles have already been discussed under "DivCHED."

#### H. Canada Conference

Dave Klein's information on the Newfoundland Conference was distributed.

#### V. New Business

#### A. DivCHED Report

Dick Jones will be presenting the 2YC<sub>3</sub> Report to the DivCHED Executive Committee meeting on Saturday in San Francisco.

#### B. 2YC, Instrumentation Institute

Dick reported that there is enough NSF money to run two sites during the summer of 1997 and registration is almost filled. The workshops will be running for one more year.

#### C. New Membership Forms

Action Item: Joanne and Dick will work on new membership forms.

#### D. Other

#### **Baseline Study**

Terri Nally of the ACS office has been trying to find matching funds to conduct a baseline study to determine characteristics of two year schools. The Ford Foundation is no longer interested. The American Institute of Physics has done a similar study and would be willing to conduct such a study as a sub-contractor to carry out the census. Terri is currently writing a proposal.

#### VI. Adjournment

Jeff made a motion and Ann seconded that the meeting be adjourned. Dick Jones adjourned the COCTYC meeting at 11:05 p.m.
