149th Two-Year College Chemistry Consortium General Membership Meeting Minutes South Suburban College South Holland, IL 60473 September 24, 1999

The meeting was called to order at SSC by Tom Gruber at 9:45 AM. Tom thanked Joe Selbka and his team for all their hard work in sponsoring the 149th meeting of the 2YC₃.

I. Introductions

Those present at the meeting introduced themselves. COCTYC members present were Dolores Aquino, Jay Bardole, Rick Bolesta, Jeff Cramer, Tom Gruber, Dick Jones and Carol White.

- II. A. The minutes of the 148th 2YC₃ General Membership Meeting held at East Los Angeles College were approved by voice vote of the attendees.
 - B. Tom Gruber explained the role of the COCTYC and the goals of the 2YC₃.

III. Reports

- A. Rick Bolesta reported on the 148th $2YC_3$ Conference held at East Los Angeles College, Monteray Park, CA, March 19 & 20, 1999. The theme was "Significant Changes in Chemical Education" with Carcy Chan as the Program Chair. There were three high-profile speakers: Carol White past COCTYC chair and winner of the CMA national Catalyst award, reminded us that even though educational technology is changing rapidly, with more interaction with computers, human interaction is still of critical importance. Editor of J Chem Ed, John Moore honored the memory of Neil Gordon, first editor of J Chem Ed and co-founder of Div. Chem. Ed.. Diane Bunce, chair-elect of the Div. Chem. Ed. discussed some of the aspects needed to be considered in designing a Chem Ed research project. There were a number of concurrent sessions: Forensic science, On-line delivery of Introd. Chem., Active learning in college classroom, Program articulation between 2 and 4 year colleges, Chem. in everyday lives, and Small-scale approach to general chemistry. There were talks about biotech workforce needs still growing (8.5%) and funding through NSF and NIH. The banquet speaker was Harold Goldwhite, "The Travelling Science Show ..." in 1800's .
- B. Treasurer's Report. Jeff Cramer, Treasurer, gave his report. The net worth of the organization is \$18,884.57.
- C. College Sponsors. Jeff Cramer reported 113 current college sponsors of the 2YC₃.
- D. Membership. Dolores Aquino reported there are 256 members as of August.
- E. Industrial Sponsors. Michaeleen Lee was not present at the meeting. There are currently 18 industrial sponsors. Texas Instruments has re-joined the group.

- F. Future Sites. Carol White noted that her phone and fax numbers listed on page one were in error. The locations of the sites of future $2YC_3$ Meetings were noted. Attendees were encouraged to host local meetings.
- G. *Outlook* Newsletter. Jay Bardole explained that the *Outloook* was one of the major ways of communicating meeting programs and abstracts (when available), letters from the Chair, what is happening in chemical education and teaching tips. Much of this information is also present on the Web at *http://jbardole.vinu.edu*.
- H. DivCHED. Carol White, DivCHED liaison, reminded us that it is possible to join DivCHED without becoming an ACS member. She explained that Div CHED has helped two-year colleges gain recognition and acceptance. They have also helped us obtain grants from the NSF.

IV. Announcements

- A. 16th Biennial Chemical Education Conference. Dick is serving as Program Chair for the Two-Year College Section and listed symposia topics. The 2YC₃ will co-sponsor an Ice Cream Social with J Chem. Ed..
- B. Journal of Chemical Education. Dolores Aquino reported for Ann Cartwright and noted the need for reviewers of the Journal and authors of 500 word articles for the $2YC_3$ column. Subscription to J. Chem. Ed. includes both the print version and the on-line version.
- C. New Conference Fees. Tom Gruber explained the new conference fee structure, which will begin in the year 2000.
- D. COCTYC Offices. Tom Gruber announced openings for the 2001 Chair-elect, Treasurer, and Newsletter Editor positions of the COCTYC.
- V. Introductions. Late-comers introduced themselves.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:45 AM.

I. Additions/Deletions to Agenda

Additions by Tom Gruber were inserted under new business.

II. Approval of Minutes, 148th Conference

The minutes were approved, with corrections, unanimously (7).

III. Reports

A. South Suburban College Conference, Joe Selbka

Joe reported the registration at 56 with \$486 collected in registration fees. They sent out 2000 mailings, but didn't feel it was effective since many didn't go to actual names. Joe said if he were to do it again, he wouldn't schedule more than two presenters concurrently. He would have also liked more help in obtaining presenters. The committee thanked Joe for his efforts at sponsoring the meeting.

B. Personnel, Tom

There were no nominations for Treasurer or Newsletter Editor to date. Rick and Frank were asked to look for qualified individuals in their local areas. Jay has agreed to start the process rolling for the first year-2000 newsletter, since its deadline must be Dec. 15 of this year.

The COCTYC would like to publicly thank Rudy Jones for his efforts as Assistant Industrial Sponsors Chair for the past 2 years.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously to appoint Michael Canestaro as Assistant Industrial Sponsors Chair.

C. Future Sites, Carol

Carol was directed to explore the possibility of holding the 156th Southern

meeting in conjunction with the ACS regional meeting in New Jersey. She will look into meetings for the 2002-2003 academic year.

Tom will initiate an e-mail discussion of the pros and cons of linking 2YC₃ meetings with regional ACS meetings.

D. 16th Biennial, Dick

Planning is going well. There are eight symposia scheduled and the call for papers has been sent out. Dick anticipates the cost to $2YC_3$ will be approximately \$2000. Most of that cost will be from the "traditional" ice-cream social, which will be a joint venture with DivCHED.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously to appoint Clarita Bhat as the $2YC_3$ program chair for the 17th Biennial Conference on Chemical Education.

E. Budget, Jeff

Jeff's report was included in the agenda book. Our net worth as of 24 August, 1999, is \$18,884.57.

Jeff will place \$2000 in the year-2000 budget for Biennial expenses. Dick also asked for funds to be included in the budget for department secretarial help in entering member addresses in a data bank. These secretarial expenses will be billed to the $2YC_3$ by the school.

Tom asked Conrad about the possibility of DivCHED increasing their \$2000 annual contribution to 2YC₃. Conrad suggested that we send in the proposal.

F. College Sponsors, Jeff

There are 113 active college sponsors for 1999. Jeff noted that data, such as phone numbers, and e-mail addresses, is missing from the list.

There are about 25 colleges with 25 years membership that are due plaques. Carol estimates the cost to be about \$30 per plaque.

G. Membership, Dolores

1999 membership to date: 256. Membership is low for this point of the year since we have had only one meeting (ELAC) which resulted in 27 renewals and 29 new members.

DivCHED treasurer, Larry Peck, has agreed to continue the program of a reduced rate of \$25.00 for combined 2YC₃ membership and *new* members of DivCHED.

Since Larry Peck will soon be replaced as DivCHED treasurer, Dolores was instructed to contact the new treasurer about the membership-rate agreement.

Dolores is working on adding e-mail addresses to our database and on reworking the membership renewal form to clarify the dual membership offer for those who want to join the division. Also, Dick Jones and Dolores are working on the upcoming election and on the production of mailing labels.

H. Industrial Sponsors, Carol for Michaeleen

There are 19 industrial sponsors, reported in the agenda book. Texas Instruments has renewed its sponsorship.

I. Editor's Report, Jay

Deadline for contributions for 1st year-2000 newsletter is December 15.

J. DivCHED, Carol

DivCHED appreciates the work of the 2YC₃.

Our policies and procedures do not align with those of DivCHED. An e-mail discussion will be initiated by Tom and our conclusions forwarded to DivCHED for action.

Carol has been appointed to the Board of Publications, starting in January.

K. J Chem Ed, Carol

Ann Cartwright is looking for articles from two-year college people, reviewers, and people to work the booth at ACS meetings.

IV. Old Business

Jay will include policies and procedures on our web-site.

Tom asked Jay to investigate the possibility and cost of obtaining a unique web-site address for the $2YC_3$.

B. Regional Advisory Board Members, Carol

C. Financial Audit

Directive from Tom: Tom, Carol and Rick will perform an in-house financial audit at the Fort Smith meeting and an outside audit will be performed at the time we change treasurers.

D. 25 Year Plaques, Carol

Already discussed in Reports, F. above.

E. By-Laws Revisited

By-laws will be made available on the Web.

F. Conference Planning Manual Revision, Tom

Tom will e-mail COCTYC members a revised copy of the Conference Planning Manual, and accept corrections. Revisions: registration form to include conference fee, one-day exhibition form, changes in the evaluation form and the need to submit all contributions to the Newsletter Editor electronically.

G. Explanation, Publication of the Conference Fee

Tom suggested that we continue to explain the change in conference fee structure [\$15 members; \$30 non-members (includes membership)] in the future newsletters.

V. New Business

A. Review/Discussion of Qualifications for COCTYC candidates, Tom

Tom initiated a discussion about the possible need to adjust candidate qualifications. He felt that the qualifications for Chair be as written in the By-laws but that other positions should be less restrictive.

Questions were raised about the requirements that the Chair-elect have served as a chair or co-chair of a conference and whether or not the conference should be a 2YC₃ conference.

A motion was made by Dick, and seconded by Rick to allow discussion, to amend the Procedures section of the COCTYC By-laws, Section C.3.(d) to read ... have demonstrated leadership and organizational ability by serving as Chair or Co-Chair for a conference, **or served one term as a member of the COCTYC**, and in one or more of the following capacities:

served three years on the Executive Committee (omit)

After discussion, the motion failed as proposed.

Jay pointed out that changes in the By-laws require a simple majority by mail ballot, thus our vote was "illegal".

Jay will e-mail the COCTYC a copy of the proposed changes to the By-laws and Tom will initiate further discussions of the topic and votes by e-mail.

Carol felt that it was important for all COCTYC members to be ACS members. When Conrad was asked about the makeup of other DivCHED committees, he informed us that ACS membership is not a requirement for some. With this new information, the consensus of the Committee was that ACS membership should *not* be a requirement for all COCTYC members.

B. Insurance Question

Carol reported that the Biennial takes out liability insurance and wondered if we need to cover our meetings with some type of liability insurance. Richard Schwenz of the J Chem Ed staff is looking into the question. Officers are covered under DivCHED insurance policy. Carol will keep us updated.

C. Need for a Program Chair

Tom suggested that one of the past-Chairs be responsible for mentoring program chairs. This and other duties, which are responsibilities of past-chairs, should be done on a three-year cycle to improve continuity. Tom will initiate e-mail discussion on this topic.

D. Approval of General Membership Minutes.

Approval of General Membership Minutes will be approved by e-mail by the COCTYC members, rather than the general membership at the next $2YC_3$ meeting.

E. Program Topics

Frank brought up the idea of workload as a discussion topic for a future meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:23 PM.
