I. Meeting called to order at 9:05 a.m. by Lance Lund

II. Approval of Minutes from COCTYC Meeting at 186th Conference

Jeff added clarification on section XII, part E: when there's a possible conflict of interest, there should be a recusal and it should be noted in the minutes. He will continue to seek a form from ACS that we can include in the conference planning manual.

Motion to approve minutes; seconded and passed unanimously

III. 187th Conference Updates

Jeff stressed the need for income statements/new members from program chairs/local arrangements chair.

IV. RAB Report

Michaeleen distributed copies of the RAB Report (see Appendix); noted that all regions are "in good shape."

Discussion: Lance proposed a possible use of the newly created RAB database: a mass emailing of newsletters to everyone (not just to "chemistry instructor") in the Western region to promote the upcoming Portland Conference. Michaeleen will talk to RAB chairs about this possibility.

Motion to accept Harper College as the host for the 197th Conference; seconded and passed unanimously

VI. Newsletter Report

Jim would like to include a "recruitment" article/ad in the newsletter to highlight the benefits of joining 2YC₃ and attending regional meetings. He plans to solicit endorsements/quotes from those attending this week's meeting.

The Chemical Heritage Foundation has submitted an article for a future newsletter.

VII. Membership Report

Frank distributed copies of the Membership Report (see Appendix).

VIII. Treasurer Report

Julie distributed copies of the Treasurer Report (see Appendix).

Discussion: Discussed possibility of granting membership and industrial sponsor chairs access to bank account for depositing membership checks in lieu of mailing them to treasurer. Julie will look into seeing what needs to done to allow this to happen.

There was questions raised concerning the projected 2010 budget for memberships (i.e. does it reflect recent increase in membership dues from \$1485 to \$2750) and recommendations that changes be made to budget reports by the treasurer to more clearly reflect where money is coming from and where it is going.

Motion to accept budget; seconded and approved unanimously

IX. College Sponsors Report

Julie distributed list of current college sponsors (see Appendix)

Discussion: there were questions on whether 2YC₃ should continue awarding twenty-five year plaques to college sponsors. Those in favor noted that, in the past, this was used as an incentive for colleges to retain their sponsorship year-over-year. Others noted that given the current state of our archives it may no longer be possible to accurately determine which schools deserve such recognition.

Motion to abolish 25-year plaques was made and seconded; motion carried with 1 opposed

X. Industrial Sponsors Report

Lance gave the report on Michele's behalf (see Appendix). Lance noted that the current list represents paid sponsors, but a few more are anticipated in the coming months.

Motion to accept reports; seconded and passed unanimously.

XI. Webmaster's report

Andy has resigned as webmaster due to personal circumstances that prevent him from committing the time required for the position. Lance agreed to act as an interim webmaster until a replacement can be found.

Motion to allow Lance to act as interim webmaster; seconded and passed unanimously.

XII. Old Business

Jeff had talked to Karen Stephens of Baton Rouge CC, but little or no progress has been made in securing funds due from the 180th meeting.

Action: Julie will obtain recognition plaques for past chairs.

XIII. New Business

A. 2YC₃ Website and Webmaster

Action: Lance, with Andy's assistance, is in the process of moving the 2YC₃ website from the Anoka-Ramsey CC server to a dedicated host.

Discussion: The website is in need of a redesign. Ideas proposed for a new site included a) a centralized area for the payment of membership dues and sponsor

fees b) a centralized location of meeting registration and payment, c) a dedicated area for the COCTYC (e.g. message board for communication). The committee recognized that this process may require the hiring of someone outside of 2YC₃, though attempts to be made to keep it within the membership. Mark volunteered to find out more information on possible options for the new site and what costs may be involved.

Motion to allow Mark to explore possible options regarding the future redesign of the 2YC₃ website; seconded and passed unanimously

Motion to allow Lance to seek candidates for a new Webmaster; seconded and passed unanimously.

B. ACS Office of Two-Year Colleges

Jodi would like her office and 2YC₃ to collaborate on building a database of twoyear colleges that can be used for outreach, surveys, etc.

Jodi updated us with the faculty status survey and asked that we assist her with forming an advisory board to look through results with her office. She will submit an item to newsletter to invite members to participate.

There is an opening in the Office of Two-Year Colleges for a program manager. Jodi will try to send an item for Jim to post in a future newsletter.

XIV. Retreat Proceedings

The committee broke up into small 2-3 person groups to review and suggest changes to the Conference Planning Manual and the Committee By-Laws, Policies and Procedures

Action: Committee should continue discussing recommended changes via email. Any proposed changes to By-laws should be sent to Jeff no later than April 1, who will distribute them to everyone by April 21. The final version of the new by-laws should be completed by May 1.
